Orientation Phase Contract Adult Treatment Court (rev.4/22/10)

The orientation phase is the first step toward entering the Treatment Court program. Orientation takes approximately one month to complete. Your official participation in Treatment Court will begin at the end of the orientation phase. During orientation, your attorney will explain the legal procedures involved with your participation in treatment court. The orientation phase will allow you to begin a treatment plan and will allow the team to see if you are serious about the program and able to follow the requirements. At the end of the orientation phase you will be able to decide whether you wish to enter the treatment court program and the treatment team will decide if the program is appropriate for your needs.

Orientation Phase Requirements

- complete treatment court orientation as directed by Court Coordinator
- complete an intake screening, evaluation and assessment with your treatment provider as directed by your case manager.
- sign all necessary authorizations to release information;
- attend community support meetings, such as AA/NA, as directed;
- maintain contact with your case manager as directed;
- submit to random drug & alcohol tests as directed by your case manager;
- attend weekly treatment court hearings.
